



## From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Parishioners,



“Lord, have mercy,” we pray at the beginning of Mass, calling upon the Lord to have mercy on us in our sinfulness. Today we celebrate that divine mercy, the mercy that is stronger than any fault, any wrong, any sin, the mercy that always seeks to reconcile us with the Lord, the mercy that led God to send his Son to win our

salvation. Let us rejoice that we will always be able to receive that tender mercy.

It was a great joy to celebrate the Triduum and Easter together! Last year, as we remember, we could not worship due to the Corona Virus situation. According to the numbers we have on record, we had 600 participants in our liturgies in these four days! On Easter Sunday we really were overjoyed in our experience that the risen Lord is in our midst and in our hearts and normal life is coming back. Let us extend this joy for the whole Easter season and every day of our life. May the joyful cheer “Alleluia!” inspire us to live the life of disciples of the Risen Jesus.

I would like to thank everyone who helped in preparation and joyful celebration of Triduum and Easter. Thank you to the women who decorated the Church: Carol Good, Helen Kreidermacher, Julia Doloszycki, and Mary Johnson. Thanks to your work, we were able to celebrate Easter in a clean and beautifully decorated church. Thank you to those who contributed to our Easter Flowers. Thank you to Jurate Lukminas, our director of music, our cantors and musicians for excellent music and singing. Thank you to the lectors, greeters, ushers, and everyone who helped make these days special. Thanks to all of you who participated in our services.

Maintenance Updates: The sacristy was showing signs of wear and tear. There were scuffed walls and patches in the ceiling where the paint was peeling. We hired Jason Fox, who painted the vestibule a few years back, to do patch and paint for us at a total cost of \$1,800.00.

We have been having trouble with the walk-in cooler in the cafeteria – it was not maintaining the correct temperature. Over the last few years, we have had different companies come out, only to have the “fix” last for a few months. The St. Vincent de Paul members asked if they could store food in there, so there was a need to get the walk-in fixed once and for all. Fran Carr, from St. Vincent de Paul, reached out to our local grocery store, Ed’s Way, to see whom they could recommend. Their recommendation was a company called Testone Mechanical. Testone recommended a much-needed new compressor for the walk-in, and some other minor repairs totaling \$3,400.00. Since the cost of a new walk-in, plus the disposal of the old one, would cost in excess of \$11,000.00, we had Testone do the repair. Testone’s repair comes with a warranty, and so far – so good!

On Tuesday, March 30, 200 parishioners from St. Bernardine and St. Luke were able to get their first Covid vaccine! This all came about with the help of one of our parishioners, Pat McKinley, who has a contact at the Jewel-Osco in Oak Park. They were looking for an organization to give the vaccines to, and Pat asked Father Stan if he would be interested. The rest is history! We were able to send the sign up Link to just the St. Bernardine and St. Luke parishioners, making it easier to get an appointment. Pharmacists from Osco came to Fearon Hall and administered the vaccine. (The second dose for those who received the first will be given on April 27.) It was a long day, starting at 9:00 am and going through 2:30 pm. Thank you to everyone who volunteered to help: Kathy Rush, Bob Fuson, Donna Dorney, Tom Gill, Deb Michalak, Mary Hibbitts, Kathy Plepel, Donna Gawlas and Della DeSonia.

Thank you for your generosity over the last few weeks. To date, our parish collected \$1,060.00 for CRS Rice Bowl and \$1,177.00 for the Holy Land.

May exultant celebration of Easter Season be to all of us a source of peace and joy!

## RESPECT LIFE

Hopefully, the **Equality Act** will not yet be law by the time you read this. Please keep in mind that **this legislation basically “guts” the Religious Freedom Restoration Act of 1993.**

*Extracts from a letter to Congress from the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops: “Everyone deserves to be treated with respect and dignity.* The Equality Act, which has now passed the U.S. House of Representatives and is being actively considered in the Senate, in many ways does the opposite and *needs to be opposed.*

“Instead of respecting differences in beliefs about marriage and sexuality, the Equality Act would discriminate against people of faith. The Equality Act would: punish faith-based organizations, such as charities and schools who serve everyone in their communities, simply because of their beliefs; force girls and women to compete against boys and men for limited opportunities in sports, and to share locker rooms and shower spaces with biological males who identify as women; risk mandating taxpayers to fund abortions; force people in

everyday life, and especially health care workers, to support gender transition; and expand what the government considers a “public” place, forcing even some parish halls to host functions that conflict with Catholic beliefs.

“The Catholic Church is the largest non-governmental provider of human services in the United States, helping millions of people in need through its parishes, schools, hospitals, shelters, legal clinics, food banks, and other charities. The same core beliefs about the human person—made with inherent dignity and in the image of God—motivate both our positions on life, marriage, and sexuality, and also our call to serve the most vulnerable and the common good. **We oppose this legislation.”**

## TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Today was once called in Latin “*Dominica in albis*,” or “Sunday in White,” because the church was full of newly baptized Christians wearing their white baptismal garments. Another old title, best forgotten, is “Low Sunday.” There’s nothing low about this festive Sunday in Easter, the eighth day since the first “Alleluia” rang out. In Christian tradition, the number eight is a symbol of fulfillment, transition, breaking through the seven-day rhythm of life to a new way of being. That is why many baptismal fonts have eight sides. The greatest feasts of our calendar are always extended for eight days, called an “octave.” In a way, this means that this first week of Easter is really considered to be one great day. This octave day of Easter sees the best features of Easter still vibrant: joyful alleluias, lush spring flowers everywhere, sprinkling with water, and a lavish table where the Lord gives us himself as bread and wine.

For Orthodox Christians, today is the Easter feast, since their tradition requires that the Christian Passover cannot begin until the days of the Jewish Passover are ended.
