From the Pastor's Desk



Dear Parishioners,

One day a tiny seed of faith was planted in you. Perhaps your parents planted it when you were just a baby. Perhaps a friend planted it during a traumatic time in your life. Perhaps it was a priest or sister or layperson who witnessed to their faith at just the right time for it to resonate within you. Every day brings an opportunity for that faith to grow. As we pray with our faith community, listen to God's word, receive the Lord in the Eucharist, and go forth energized for the Christian mission, may our faith be increased, exercised, and strengthened for our life's journey.

On Monday, June 7, we participated in the Parish Listening Session, which is a part of the Renew My Church Initiative. There were 47 parishioners that attended in person and seven via Zoom. The Listening Session was a good opportunity for us to ask questions regarding the unification process of uniting the parishes of St. Luke and St. Bernardine, and I thank everyone who attended this event.

I am pleased to announce that we are again able to celebrate our patron saint, St. Bernardine. Though it may be late this year (we usually celebrate in May), we have recently been given the "green light" by the Archdiocese to hold parish functions. I am hoping you can join us on Sunday, June 27 after the 10:30 mass, for a few hours of food and fun. We will be serving the usual fare of hot dogs and hamburgers, chips and soft drinks (and maybe a Raffle or two). As is customary, this will be the parish's gift to our parishioners, and there

will be no charge. The Archdiocese of Chicago is following the Governor's plan for reopening the state, (Phase 5), and in light of that, you will not need to wear a mask during this event; however, you are more than welcome to do so if you choose.

Following are some of the changes we are making effective with this weekend's masses:

- If you have been fully vaccinated, you are no longer required to wear a mask during mass, and you will not need to present your vaccination card.
- If you have not been vaccinated, *you are encouraged to wear a mask.*
- There is no longer a need to sign up for mass.
- Communal singing is once again allowed during mass.
- We will not be removing the "crosses" from the pews, as social distancing is still encouraged.
- Hand sanitizer will still be available at all entrances/exits for you to use at your own discretion.

I would like to thank everyone for their patience and understanding during the past year. It has been a long road, and I am thankful that everyone was willing to do what was necessary so that we could worship at mass together.

GOD'S TIME

We either pay attention to or ignore “clock time” as we play in the summer sun and note the earth’s tilt and the lengthening days. We live by time. We reckon time in seconds and minutes and hours, or we use broader chunks like supertime and summertime.

God keeps another sort of time. God speaks to us of “saving time,” that is, the time of salvation. This sense of time is called *kairos*, and this time is always now, always present and available, always revealing, often surprising.

This Sunday’s readings alert us to the reality and the import of God’s time. Ezekiel and the Gospel of Mark remind us that our labor and our plotting and our planning rest in God. For God takes our smallest efforts and makes of them great works. Paul points us to the “harvest” time, urges us to be watchful for its coming, and calls us to recognize that we must spend our time pleasing God.

The Saint Bernardine's St. Vincent de Paul Society needs volunteers to help with a "food rescue" effort. A company donates their overproduction excess food to a group called Project 22/NINE. "The generous will be blessed, for they share their food with the poor." (Proverbs 22:9)

Our St. Vincent de Paul assists them in distributing their food to needy persons (homeless shelters, food pantries, soup kitchens, etc.). The donated food comes in two forms, five gallon buckets and individually packaged single meals. The volunteers for the bucket effort would need to be able to lift and transport 30-40 lb. each bucket for delivery to various locations. This would require a one or two day commitment (2 to 3 hour approx. each day). Volunteers for the "rescue" of individual meals would be asked to go get the meals and transport them to St. B's for organizing and distribution.
