From the Pastor's Desk



Dear Parishioners,

First, I would like to share some information regarding my health. My broken leg stayed in a cast for six weeks. A recent X-ray showed that the treatment is going well.

It does not mean, however, that I am able to fly a long-distance flight yet. To be ready for this challenge, the doctor has recommended 10

rehabilitation sessions, which I started on Tuesday. I am hopeful that when I finish rehabilitation, I will be ready to fly back to the U.S.

I truly wish to be with you, but my doctor said that a nine-hour flight might cause blood clots in my body, which would be a serious and dangerous condition. After the rehabilitation I will see the doctor again and I hope that he will allow me to fly.

Please know that my heart wants to be with you, but the recommendation of the medical professionals are keeping me in Poland. I am in touch with Fr. Ed several times each week, and our staff and our RMC committees, as well as the bishop's office. I am very grateful for your prayers and support. Be assured that you — my parishioners — are in my daily prayers.

Thank you to all those who participated in the Winter Coat Drive this year. The result of the drive is very impressive! Your generosity allows many of the students at The Learning Center to make it through Chicago's often challenging winters with coats and other warm accessories, which every human being deserves. Thank you!

You will recall that second collections for World Missions and our Archdiocesan seminarians were taken recently. To date, we have collected a combined total of \$2,768 for the seminarians and \$2,709 for World Mission Sunday. Your generosity is again very much appreciated in the mission countries as well as in our seminary.

Our parish 7th and 8th graders are joining others from St. Vincent and St. Edmund for a joint Holy

Fire retreat in Fearon Hall at the St. Bernardine Campus this Friday and Saturday. It's an action-packed presentation by the Archdiocese that is a good example of how we can do much more by pooling our resources both at the archdiocesan level and locally. We ask that all parishioners join in praying for our *confirmandi* as they take the next steps of preparation for this sacrament in the coming months.

We alternated special Masses this month between our churches to be inclusive of both parish communities. Even though All Saints Day was not a holy day of obligation this year, we scheduled an additional evening Mass at St. Luke because this is a popular devotion for many parishioners. We then scheduled the Mass of Remembrance at St. Bernardine on November 15, and then the Thanksgiving Day Mass will be at the St. Luke campus. We hope our parishioners will really take to heart that we are one parish with two worship sites and feel at home in either church. We've already seen signs of this at the morning Masses on weekdays as we see more new faces in each church.

Another opportunity to gather together as one church is Game Day in Fearon Hall. This is a long-time tradition for St. Bernardine that is very important to the many people who put hours and hours into planning and running this fun event. If you are a sports fan, especially a Bears fan, this is a way to find a common bond in our civic pride as well as our unified parish family. Please come out and celebrate this fun fall time together.

Game Day will take place on Sunday, November 21 from 11:30 am until 4:00 pm. You can read more details about Game Day in the parish bulletins.

A new tradition for our newly unified parish: the first annual TLB Turkey Sunday

With our newly unified parish comes new opportunities to not only share with our sharing parish but also with those right here in our local community. Hence, a long-standing tradition of Turkey Sunday is now starting anew as **SLB Turkey Sunday** this year.

The first annual SLB Turkey Sunday will be on the Sunday before Thanksgiving, November 21. This is our way of sharing our blessings with those in need for this holiday when we all thank God for whatever gifts have been bestowed on us.

The preparations actually will begin the day before — on Saturday morning, November 20 — with the transfer of frozen turkeys stored in the St. Luke School freezer to the Parish Food Pantry at St. Bernardine's rectory at 8:30 am. The Food Pantry opens at 9:00 am, and families have already been pre-identified to receive the frozen turkeys along with food from the pantry.

Our St. Vincent de Paul Chapter also has identified some parish shut-ins who will receive frozen turkeys and other food items. Next year we hope to expand this to more shut-ins.

On Saturday afternoon, volunteers will pack bags of food, including potatoes, sweet potatoes, onions, carrots, bags of stuffing and corn bread mix, and cans of corn, green beans, and cranberries that will be delivered on Sunday.

Then on SLB Turkey Sunday morning, volunteers at each worship site will collect frozen turkeys and cash donations before and after each Mass. We need parishioners to donate **60** large frozen turkeys this morning because the frozen turkeys we buy are smaller and we need these for some larger families on our list. **(Please do not bring any frozen turkeys on Saturday!)**

Later that Sunday morning and early that afternoon, volunteers will deliver the frozen turkeys along with bags of food to our sharing parish, **St. Agatha**, in the Chicago neighborhood of North



Lawndale. These packages will be distributed to families in the community, to families of youth participating at the Blessed Sacrament Catholic Youth Center, and to The Learning Center, which provides free adult education programs for our neighbors in the Chicago neighborhoods of North Lawndale and Little Village and more than 20 other zip codes. The frozen turkeys and bags of food will be given to families identified in advance on Sunday afternoon.

We will need a lot of volunteers, including people with large cars, SUVs, and pick-up trucks to transport the frozen turkeys and the many bags that will be filled with food. After all, we are planning to provide food for Thanksgiving meals to approximately **240 families**.

To accomplish this huge feat, we will need lots of helping hands. Here is how you can participate in SLB Turkey Sunday:

- Checks can also be dropped in the offertory collection or mailed to the parish office as long as you put *SLB Turkey Sunday* on the memo line.



FEAST OF FAITH

Concluding Rites

The Prayer after Communion gives us a glimpse of the heavenly banquet, of which we have had a foretaste in the Eucharist. The concluding rites speak of what we are to do with this great gift of God. That includes the parish announcements, which usually follow the Prayer after Communion.

Believe it or not, the announcements, which are not an “official” part of the Mass, have been included in the Mass from as early as the 5th century! The deacon or the homilist — even the bishop — would announce upcoming liturgical celebrations and encourage the people to participate. Today’s parish announcements include opportunities for prayer, service, learning, and community building. They should be succinct and should include only significant events and activities in the life of the parish. But even when they are long and tedious, the announcements (and the parish bulletin) flow out of the concluding rites of the Mass.

They offer us ways to live the Eucharist, to become what we have received — the Body of Christ, living and active in our local community.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

New religious faith gives fresh lenses for viewing human customs, and the wisdom to transform them. In the ancient world, the Romans feared the dead. Funeral customs were designed to hasten the departure of souls to the next world. Cremation was the rule, although burial increased in popularity in the 2nd century. Procession from the place of death to the place of cremation or burial was the most important part of the funeral. Those who carried the funeral bier carried it low, close to the ground, to promote the soul’s departure to the nether world.

Christians, on the other hand, did not fear the dead, but cherished them as they consigned them to Christ’s love and protection. Gradually, they began to reject customs rooted in fear. Christians carried their dead to their resting places singing, with the bier carried high, away from the ground and toward the heavens. For the Christian, the grave was a sign of hope and a place of remembrance. Superstitious Romans feared burial places, and so the Christians cherished them as places of remembrance and prayer, and in time, even celebrated the Eucharist there. In November, many of us visit the cemetery for prayer and the autumn clean-up. By cherishing our dead, we are responding in faith to a vital part of our Christian tradition.
